

## PRESIDENTIAL STATE OF THE HILL ADDRESS:

Greetings from Heritage Hill. Midsummer is upon us. Where does the time go? Only about five or six week until the 2014 Heritage Hill Threshing Show will once again be upon us. Plans for the show are in place and as always we are hoping for great weather. Not all threshing shows have experienced great weather conditions this year. Unfortunately, the West Central Antique Power Collectors located along Minnesota Highway 7 near Blomkest fell victim to Mother Nature as the annual power show scheduled for June 20 to 22 was canceled as a result of the extreme rains received. Weather is always a risk when planning an outdoor event. Since the annual threshing show has been located at Heritage Hill, the organization has seen its share of extreme weather conditions as well. The 2007 show as a complete rain-out. Although Friday was good, Friday and Saturday was an attendance disaster. Heavy precipitation was not the issue. Throughout the show Saturday and Sunday the rain was light, the air was damp and cool, the show site was muddy, and the spectators were not too inclined to spend the day at Heritage Hill in those conditions. Heritage Hill has experience other extremes including light frost one year, and high heat and humidity a couple of other years. Recently, extreme precipitation is the topic of conversation everywhere we go. Currently, the crop conditions are not good, with large volumes of acres damaged by excess water. Hopefully, there are better growing conditions ahead in July and August.

Thanks to all who participated in the annual Heritage Hill picnic on June 17. It was fun to see all the members and families in attendance. Thanks are extended to Kaylee Kleene, the 2013-2014 Heritage Hill Queen, for her participation and dedication to attending the parades and other events. Congratulation is also extended to Laura VanRavenswaay for being elected the 2014-2015 Heritage Hill Queen. With excessive rain the grass continues to grow at Heritage Hill. Thanks to all the volunteers who continue to help with the HH mowing. There was a good outpouring of lawn mowers and operators on June 26. If the moisture continues, there will be many more forthcoming mowing events. Please watch your email for announcements, and spread the word to those without email regarding the date and time to mow.

June 24 long-time Heritage Hill member Richard Emch hosted an auction sale, selling many tractors, collectables and parts. It was a good day with many friends and neighbors and bidders from far and wide in attendance. Richard reported that he was very satisfied with the results. Farm auctions are a great way to spend a day—offering a chance to socialize with rural neighbors, and the opportunity to buy anything from antiques and collectibles to land and livestock, or tractors and trucks. You just never know what you will find at a farm auction. The word "auction" is derived from the Latin augeō which means "I increase" or "I augment". The earliest recorded use of auctions dates back to about 500 years BC, in Babylon, when women were auctioned off for marriage. The Romans used auctions to dispose of all kinds of property, from grain and livestock, to the spoils of war. In fact, in 193 AD the Praetorian Guard sold the whole Empire at auction, after killing the ruling Emperor, Pertinax. The British style of auctioneering made its way to the New World with early settlers, but it



was often used for selling out the property of debtors—or for selling slaves, giving early auctions in this country a bad name. After the Civil War, Army Colonels traveled around the country selling seized and surplus Army goods. Civilian auctioneers followed the Colonels around, and dressed similarly, so that soon the public began to address all auctioneers as Colonel, title still used by auctioneers today. At present, over 35,000 auctioneers practice the trade. Most are generalists, selling antiques one day, livestock the next day and used restaurant equipment another. The auctioneer works for a seller, and his or her goal is to maximize profit for the seller. Like all other facets of agriculture, farm auctions continue to change. Farm auctions become fewer every year, just as the number of farm operators continue to decrease. Technology is rapidly changing the logistics of farm auctions. Today, many auctioneers provide the farm equipment buyers the option to bid online wherever an internet connection can be established. Then of course there is eBay, where anything imaginable can be purchased via auction.

I hope you experienced a safe and enjoyable Independence Day. I hope to see you at the Heritage Hill membership meeting scheduled for July 15. The 34<sup>th</sup> annual Heritage Hill Threshing Show, featuring Minneapolis Moline, is just 1 ½ months away!

Secretary Heath read the minutes of the June 5, 2014 Meeting M/S/P Kleene/Roe to approve the minutes

The July financial report was unavailable.

- **Show Guide**: The show guides have been delivered to Heritage Hill and are ready to be distributed.
- Car Parkers: Cory Butler and his family have agreed to park cars from horseback on Fri, Aug. 15, Sat. Aug 16 and Sun Aug.17 for a fee of \$600.00.
