DIRECTOR MEETING MINUTES: August 6, 2015

President Thompson called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm at Heritage Hill, Montevideo.

Quorum: *Present* – Thompson, Hegna, Bergquist, Heath, Molde, Grube, Sellman, Kleene, Kanten, Roe *Guests: 5* Secretary Heath presented the minutes of the July 2, 2015 directors meeting M/S/P Hegna/Sellman to approve the minutes

Treasurer Bergquist gave the July 2015 financial report. Corrections to report: Donations and Sponsorships should be listed in separate categories. M/S/P Grube/Roe to approve the report.

- **Farm Report**: The wheat has been cut, bundled and loaded on the racks. The remainder of the wheat has been combined and sold. The yield was between 60 and 65 bushels per acre.
- **Kitchen repairs:** The repairs from the water damage are in the completion stages. Electricians, plumbers and the contractor are finishing installing all the equipment and putting everything back in place. Volunteers will be contacted when the kitchen is ready for the final cleaning before the Threshing Show.
- **Nominating Committee**: A minimum of three members will be selected at the membership meeting on August 18, 2015 for the nominating committee. The election of officers and 3 directors will take place during the October 2015 membership meeting.
- **Disposal of the straw**: Melvin Mortenson has requested to remove the straw stack created during the threshing. President Thompson honored his request with the stipulation that the straw be removed within three days following the show. If the straw is not removed in a timely fashion the farm committee will dispose of the straw.
- Cockshutt Flags: The Cockshutt collectors will bring the flags to be displayed during the threshing show.
- **Handicap Groups**: Groups of clients from handicap facilities, assisted living, and nursing homes will be admitted to the show without charge if they are together in a group. The groups must have their own staff or volunteers to assist the clients.
- **Show Guides**: Several show guides are remaining to be handed out. Everyone was reminded to distribute them to the public.
- **Heritage Hill Clothing**: Monica Engen reported on the clothing in stock at the present time. Monica and Sandy Faehn will price the items at a reduced price to clear out the old stock and will order some new items as needed. The directors gave the approval for Monica and Sandy to make the decisions.
- **Preparing the Grounds**: The mowing will be started on Monday, August 17, 2015 at 9 am. The buildings will be cleaned out by Wednesday, August 19 and the final day of cleanup and set up will be completed on Thursday, August 20. A light lunch being served in the Thresher's Kitchen at noon on Thursday.

- **Sponsorship and Advertising**: Several sponsors have been secured to pay for the expenses for the tractor and lawn mower pulls. Gerald Kleene is the coordinator for the advertising.
- **Chairman:** Gerald Kleene reviewed the list of chairpersons for each of the positions for the Threshing Show. The complete list will be printed in the August newsletter.
- **Deposit for Facility Usage:** A discussion was held about charging a security deposit for the usage of the show grounds and buildings. Everyone using the facility is given a list of rules which includes giving a free will donation and leaving the area as it was found. M/S/P Berguist/Sellman to not charge a security deposit.
- **Usage of Facility:** Bourne Family Reunion in the Hanson Building and on the grounds on Saturday August 8, 2015. A Class reunion will be held in the Thresher's Kitchen on Saturday, August 29, 2015. \$100.00 was prepaid by the Class reunion committee.
- **Heritage Hill Repairs:** There are several repairs and cleanups still needed to be completed at Heritage Hill. Contact Gene Zeller if volunteers are available to work on the repairs.
- **Goose Hunting:** Several Goose Hunters have been given permission to hunt on Heritage Hill Grounds with the understanding that they are courteous to each other and keep the grounds clean and undamaged.
- **Tree Watering:** Due to the death of Phillip Thissen, a volunteer is needed to water the trees at Heritage Hill. Phillip has been a very dedicated volunteer at Heritage Hill and he will be greatly missed.
- **Petting Zoo:** Brenda Sharar has requested to set up a petting zoo during the Threshing Show. She will furnish all the animals and be totally in charge. Brenda will also sign a waiver taking full responsibility for her animals and their actions. M/S/P Roe/Bergquist to approve the Petting Zoo. The site for the petting zoo will be decided in the near future.
- Raffle Tickets: A reminder was given to everyone to turn in their raffle tickets by August 18, 2015.

- **Farming Crew**: The wheat will be cut on Monday, July 27, 2015 if the weather permits. Workers are needed to pitch bundles onto the wagons.
