essential to have the grounds looking as nice as possible. Wheat bundles will be ready for loading in a couple of weeks. Help is greatly needed when the bundles are loaded on the wagons. Family, neighbors, church kids, are all welcome.

For those who are into locomotive steam engines, there was quite an event in Duluth on July 20th. Union Pacific Big Boy 4014 traveled from Cheyenne, Wyoming to Duluth to display at the railroad museum. This 4-8-8-4 configuration steam engine, at just over 1,200,000 pounds, was one of the largest locomotives ever built. It could use 19,487 pounds (8,839 kilograms) of coal and 9,078 gallons of water per hour. It was used to pull trains over the mountains around Wyoming and Utah region. There were 25 of these units built with 14 remaining with most of them being static display. Locomotive 4014 had been on display in California before it was moved to Cheyenne for a rebuild last year. Locomotive 4014 was in Duluth for one day before heading off to Altoona, Wisconsin and then to Illinois and beyond. There are fewer and fewer people that remember the days when steam ruled the rails. Like tractor enthusiasts, thank goodness we have those who want to preserve that part of history.

As a reminder to all Heritage Hill members, if you have any questions or concerns, please forward your thoughts to any Heritage Hill officer or board member. Membership input is very important when making decisions for the future of the organization.

Schultz presented the minutes of the July 7, 2019 Board of Directors meeting. M/S/P Kleene/Hegna to approve the minutes. Thissen presented the July Treasurer's Report. M/S/P Coon/Johnson to approve the report.

- **Raffle Tickets:** Many raffle tickets are still outstanding; many are still available for sale. Deliver tickets and proceeds to Johnson as soon as possible.
- Show Guides: Show guides are available for distribution need to be distributed.
