

### PRESIDENTIAL STATE OF THE HILL ADDRESS:

Greetings from Heritage Hill. I hope the winter season has been good for you and hope you have remained healthy. I am filling in for the vacationing Heritage Hill President Grant Schmieg who in Arizona enjoying some warm weather. I would like to thank Grant for his leadership these past two years. It is very inspiring to have young new members share their talents with the organization. Much has been accomplished.

Recently, I received a copy of an article from Gas Engine Magazine, July 1985. authored by Mike Milbrandt. Heritage Hill, known only as Minnesota Valley Antique Farm Power and Machinery Association at that time, was only four years old and growing rapidly. The annual Threshing Show was then held on the Denny and Patty Kurtzbein farm. Of particular interest was some of the tractors and equipment exhibited at those shows. There were 85 tractors on display at the 1984 show

including four Hubers, fourteen Minneapolis-Molines, three Twin-Cities and a cross-motor Minneapolis. There was also 20 John Deeres, 18 International-Harvesters, 15 Allis-Chalmers along with Case, Oliver, Hart-Parr and others. Two Case steam engines were used for threshing and to pull an eight-bottom gang plow.

As I continued to read through the article I realized how, as things change, how much they stay the same. Minnesota Valley Antique Farm Power and Machinery Association was incorporated in 1985 with the intent of "Demonstration, Preservation and Education of Agricultural History". Specifically, one objective of MVAFPMA at that time was to demonstrate how the machines of old worked. Heritage Hill continues it same mission with cutting and binding of wheat, when the weather conditions cooperate, threshing, saw mill demonstrations, corn shelling, shingle milling, plowing, tractor parades and gas engine restoration and operations, among other things. The flea market, good food, Friday night



tractor pulls, and Saturday night dances were also featured. We are pleased that once again steam engines and a gang plow are regular attractions among the Heritage Hill events.

Time has not been our friend. Like most other organizations, Heritage Hill struggles with aging membership and the urbanization of America. As members age, many are no longer able to operate the machines they once owned, so the time arrives when those cherished treasures are passed on to others. Those same aging members may once have had family members that helped with threshing show activities, but for various reasons those family members may have relocated, and their assistance is no longer available. When Mom and Dad were no longer able to be active in the organization, the children lost interest in helping in their various capacities. Many good members have been lost over the years. Heritage Hill is fortunate to have a younger core group of folks working hard to keep the heritage alive. I, for one, am very grateful for that.

We are half way through February and are happy that spring is just around the corner. The wind and cold this winter have been noteworthy. Snowfall accumulation has been relatively low in this area. Projects are pending at the show site once spring arrives. Please plan to attend the next membership meeting March 6 at the Montevideo Community Center to learn what all is being planned and what will be happening at Heritage Hill. I hope to see you then!


