Happy New Year! I hope 2018 finds everybody in great health and good spirits, ready for new challenges and opportunities in the year ahead. The holiday season has come and gone, in the blink of an eye, as it seems. The joys of Christmas are always fun when spent with friends and love ones. I trust you had a pleasurable few weeks celebrating traditions with family. After the activities cease, it is also good to resume the normal flow of daily life. So far the winter season has started erratically, which seems to be the norm in recent years. Up until the week before Christmas the temperatures were unseasonably warm, shortening the winter months for those of us who prefer a short winter, but also shortening it (unfortunately) for those of us who bank on a cold winter as needed for ice fishing and like activities. I spent a number of days in December clearing brush from a wooded area in Granite Falls. The weather was great. When finishing one evening, it was dark and the brush pile was burning. I sat on the pickup tailgate and just enjoyed the great outdoors, which seemed odd for early December. Suddenly that all changed. In past years the president had the implied responsibility to coordinate the Threshing Show. A designated Threshing Show coordinator, as approved by the HH Board of Directors, will be new in 2018, a means of dividing duties and reducing the time commitment required of past presidents. A special thank you goes out to the 2017 officers and directors, as well as all members who help make this organization a great success.

At times finding something new to share in the world of collecting antiques can be a challenge. In 2017 I was introduced to a rather new antique collecting concept: "Preservation versus Restoration". This past year I had the opportunity to assist the International Harvester Collectors, Chapter 26, Minnesota North Dakota club in re-grouping its organizational structure. At the end of the day it proved to be a very educational process. The entire process took about eight months of diligent efforts working with the Minnesota and North Dakota Secretary of States and the Internal Revenue Service. After much persistence the organization achieved its goal of becoming a non-profit organization. In the process I was introduced to a number of good folks, who possess a vast array of International Harvester knowledge and collecting experiences, many who I now consider good friends. One such couple, Doug and Evie Schlieff, Glenwood, Minnesota, currently serve as President and Secretary, respectively, of the organization. At the age of 91 years, my father Kenneth Bergquist, Dassel, died this past May, thankfully leaving behind many great memories.....along with some old farm equipment. Dad owned a small acreage and ended his farming years with a Farmall 656 and a Farmall 300. Through the process of preparing the farm for sale, Doug Schlieff became interested in both tractors and purchased the units back in July. Doug is part of an ever-growing movement to "preserve" collectables rather than "restore", and so was the case with the IH tractors. The idea is to get the old equipment operational, repair as needed, replace gaskets and seals to eliminate the leaks, and then preserve its current appearance. Rather than apply the new coat of paint, preserve what is there, clear coat as needed. Doug reported that he has completed the preservation of both the 656 and 300; I am excited to see the end results.

- **Lion's Club Circus:** Wes Thompson has agreed to be the club liaison for the Lion's Club circus to be held June 7<sup>th</sup>. Thank You Wes!
- **Winter Board Meetings:** The Board will be meeting at the Chamber of Commerce offices during the months of January, February and March.
- **Raffle:** Raffle tickets have been printed. Dustin Johnson has them and has agreed to take care of the bookkeeping and accounting part of the raffle. We still need an individual or individuals to be in charge of ticket sales.
- **JD Planter Clinic:** Kibble Equipment, Inc. had expressed an interest in doing its annual Planter Clinic at Heritage Hill. Bob Schultz will be the contact person on that. The limiting factor may be the weather. (It is usually fairly cold during planter clinic season.) They have also expressed an interest in doing a Combine Clinic during the 2018 show.
- **Job Assignments:** Gerald Kleene indicated that he will be willing to take care of the 2018 Tractor Pull arrangements. He has already been in contact with the people who took over DeVos' "Scrap Iron Express" sled business. Gerald is also getting bids on "commemoratives" (cup, pins and plaques). Sally Phillips Helling and Waunita Kanten chairing the advertising aspect of the show (posters, ads, show guides etc.) We also still need chairs for the following areas: 1) **2018 Queen Coronation**; 2) **Concession Stand**; 3) **Trackside Food Stand**; and as previously mentioned, 4) **Raffle Ticket Sales Director**.

Not many people realize that the Volstead Act, (enacted on October 28<sup>th</sup>, 1919 to carry out the intent of the 18th Amendment, which established prohibition in the United States) was named after US Senator Andrew Volstead of Granite Falls. This caused illegal moonshine operations to spring up all over the area. We could possibly acquire a small still and distill (**FAKE**) moonshine with some historical presentation.
- **Perpetual Ad:** The possibility of having a monthly ad or article of interest in the local newspaper(s) was discussed as a way to increase participation on the Hill.
- **Sponsorship:** As previously agreed, we will not be selling ads for the tractor pull, but instead general support ads will be sought. Too many weather related tractor pull cancellations or postponements have occurred to make a tractor pull effective for the sponsors.
- **Auction:** Fragodt Auctioneering has expressed interest in having another auction this year. That would probably mean having an onsite Consignment Auction, or an Estate Sale as much of our inventory of old iron was sold last year.
- **Queen's and President's Portraits:** We need someone to update the Queens and President's photos on the south wall of the Thresher's Kitchen. It appears we will also need a new frame or two. It looks bad when we don't keep these up.

**EXTRAS: An Amazing 2-letter English Word**

A reminder that one word in the English language that can be a noun, verb, adjective, adverb and preposition: UP

Read until the end.....you will laugh. This two-letter word in English has more meanings than any other two-letter word, and that word is 'UP.' It is listed in the dictionary as an [adv], [prep], [adj], [n] or [v]. It is easy to understand UP, meaning toward the sky or at the top of the list, but when we awaken in the morning, why do we wake UP? At a meeting, why does a topic come UP? Why do we speak UP, and why are the officers UP for election and why is it UP to the secretary to write UP a report? We call UP our friends, brighten UP a room, polish UP the silver, warm UP the leftovers and clean UP the kitchen. We lock UP the house and fix UP the old car. At other times, this little word has real special meaning. People stir UP trouble, line for tickets, work UP an appetite, and think UP excuses. To be dressed is one thing but to be dressed UP is special. This UP is confusing: A drain must be opened UP because it is stopped UP. We open UP a store in the morning but we close it UP at night. We seem to be pretty mixed UP about UP! To be knowledgeable about the proper uses of UP, look UP the word UP in the dictionary. In a desk-sized dictionary, it takes UP almost 1/4 of the page and can add UP to about thirty definitions. If you are UP to it, you might try building UP a list of the many ways UP is used. It will take UP a lot of your time, but if you don't give UP, you may wind UP with a hundred or more. When it threatens to rain, we say it is clouding UP. When the sun comes out, we say it is clearing UP. When it rains, the earth soaks it UP. When it does not rain for awhile, things dry UP.
