Minnesota has many great places to visit as well. My wife has lived here for 31 years and has never been to Duluth so you might say that is on our bucket list.

### **EXTRAS:** Dawson Name Origin

Dawson was platted in 1884. The city was named for William Dawson, one of three partners in the Dawson Townsite Company. William Dawson was born in Ireland, 1825, was mayor of Saint Paul, Minnesota from 1878 to 1881. He was a successful banker. When elected he was the first mayor to be Irish in Saint Paul. He died February 19, 1901, destitute after his Bank of Minnesota failed five years prior to his death. There is a two-acre park named after him in Saint Paul. A post office has been in operation at Dawson since 1884. The city was incorporated in 1885.

Dustin Johnson read the minutes of the June 2, 2019 Directors' Meeting. M/S/P Bergquist/Ashling to approve the minutes. Bergquist gave the June 2019 Treasurer's report. M/S/P Kleene/Ashling to approve the report.

- Show Guides: The Show Guides for the 2019 Threshing Show are in the Thresher's Kitchen. Take a box or more to distribute.
- **Women's Building:** Exhibitors are needed in the Hanson Building during the Threshing Show. As of now, there are none planning to be there.
- Overhead Door Maintenance: The door on the Ost building was adjusted today. The door on the Chippewa building is okay for now.
- Barnaal Building: Some roof boards and floor boards need to be fixed. A work day should be scheduled this fall to take care of it if there are not enough funds to re-do the roof at that time.
- Extra Hay Racks: There are a number of hay racks that are in poor condition. These will be stored outside. If not needed next year, the racks will be thrown out and the running gear used elsewhere. Three loads of bundles and good racks will be stored inside for next year's June show.
- **Upcoming Elections:** All officer positions are up for election along with three board positions for expiring terms of Ashling, Finn, and Johnson. More candidates are needed. The annual elections are held at the October membership meeting.

- Packer for Pulling Track: The County will let us use the packer if they are asked and offered passes to the show.
- **City of Watson Anniversary:** MVAFPMA was asked to provide tractor rides during Watson's event; the request was declined due to liability concerns. The club is still welcome to participate in Watson's event on July 27.
- Chippewa County Fair Tractor Pull: In the past club members have provided a pull-off tractor for the County Fair tractor pull. No one has expressed interest in doing that this year, so we will decline if asked.

- Church Service Pastor: Jim Roe has been searching and unable to find for a pastor to lead the Sunday morning church service during the 2019 Threshing Show. He is asking for suggestions.
- Lawn Mowing: Next mowing at Heritage Hill will be Tue. July 7 at 9:00. If it is raining, it will be postponed to Wed.
- Shower: The equipment has arrived and the shower facility will be assembled by volunteers.
- **Weed Whip:** The new electric weed whip, along with its battery and charger, is stored in the storage building near the kitchen. Club members are encouraged to use it.
- **Holtan Powerhouse:** Modifications to the interior of the Powerhouse have been paid for by the exhibitors who are in the process of setting up their engines for display. Although some storage space is lost, having the building full of gas engine exhibits was the intent of the original donor.
- **Popcorn Shack:** Jim Roe has been working on painting the popcorn shack. He suggested a review be done of the equipment inside.
- Events at Heritage Hill: Our Savior's of Montevideo will be using the church and kitchen for a service on Wed. July 17. Our Saviour's of Baxter will be doing the same on Wed. July 24.
