

PRESIDENTIAL STATE OF THE HILL ADDRESS:

Greetings from Heritage Hill.

Heritage Hill is celebrating its 16th year of development. The land was acquired in late 1999, and beginning in early 2000 much volunteer time was spent scrambling to develop the site, constructing the Threshers' Kitchen and a few other facilities, just in time to host the first Threshing Show in August 2000. One huge disadvantages of developing a show site from a bare farm field was the lack of trees. Transplanting trees in 2000 became one of the top priorities as shade is a valued commodity during the heat of the summer. Somewhere around 20 smaller sized trees were transplanted, many around the parade route. Since then many other trees have been added over the years, and alas the tree have grown and are providing significant shade around the grounds. Unfortunately not many of us members will live long enough to see the trees mature to their maximum potential. In any event the survival of most of the trees is credited generally to one individual. Thanks are extended to Philip Thissen who has taken on the responsibility the past 16 years to add water whenever



the trees were in need. Recently, a tree was planted on the Heritage Hill show site in honor and thanks to Phil's continued efforts.


The 2015 HH Threshing Show will feature the 8th annual HH tractor pull, an event first initiated in 2008. For HH to maintain its continued success the organization must continue to change and add new attractions, just as the demographics and life styles of the community continue to change. We are all aware that change is inevitable and for many of us change may not come too easy. The tractor pull has been a major addition to the annual threshing show as the tractor pull events draw large audiences, adding not only to the gate revenues but also significantly increasing food sales. Most importantly, the tractor pull provides a service and source of entertainment to our guests. By in large the interests of those attending the threshing show differ to a degree from those attending the tractor pull. It has become quite apparent that many who attend the tractor pulls are interested in consuming beer while watching the events. Hosting a beer garden at the tractor pull has been a subject of increasing discussion for some time. At the April membership meetings the possibility of a beer garden was introduced for discussion and consideration. As anticipated the feedback from the membership has been interesting and mixed. There are many factors to consider prior to moving ahead with beer sales. First, the beer garden is under consideration for the 2016 show, not 2015. If beer sales were approved at the tractor pull, an experienced and licensed third party vendor would most likely be needed to operate and manage the beer sales, much like the operations of alcohol beverage sales at other local special events. Special event liquor licensing, liability insurance and added security are other factors that need exploration prior to moving forward with any such plans. In any event the consideration of a beer garden will be a learning experience for us all.

These past few weeks have been a difficult time for our family. Dorraine and I were once again reminded that life can be very fragile. Our son-in-law Darrel Streed died May 20 at a young age of 59 after being diagnosed with cancer only a couple weeks prior. Darrel was a life-long resident of Milan, having been baptized and later confirmed at Kviteseid Lutheran Church in 1970, and graduated from Milan High School in 1973. Darrel was a member of the Milan Fire Department and took part in many Milan civic activities. He will be missed by many friends and a very extended family. Please keep our daughter Naomi, grandsons Jeremy Streed and wife Amy and Jesse Streed, and great-grandchildren Caden and Brielle in your thoughts and prayers.
