PRESIDENTIAL STATE OF THE HILL ADDRESS:

Welcome to March! I am always anxious for how the month arrives. In like a lamb, out like a lion or vice versa. Time will tell if this holds true. March has certainly come in like a lamb. As the days get longer and warmer, our thoughts turn to outdoor activities. Heritage Hill will have to move everything up on the schedule this year with the earlier show date. If you know of things that need to completion, please do not hesitate to assemble a work crew and proceed with the project.

As I indicated last month, I have been trying to find a solution for a nonexistent part: A neoprene rear crankshaft seal for my Farmall 400 diesel. Several conversations have been held with longtime Farmall people who affirm that there is not one to be had in the country. I contacted a few companies that custom make seals. What was determined is that those vendors are more than happy to manufacture any part if I order a batch of 1,000 or more! I had contact with a fellow in New York who said he had a couple places who may be able to help me out. I shipped the old seal and seal retainers out to him but unfortunately, he passed away from a malfunctioning furnace at 28 years old no one knew what became of my parts. I then had one made on a 3-D printer. It worked initially but the silicone must have reacted with the engine oil and ended up shrinking causing it to leak bad. Some folks said to install the old fashioned felt which didn't work either. The crankshaft is ground differently on the tractors that used that type of seal. All that was left was to replace the crankshaft and seal retainer with one out of an MD or early 400. In one last effort, I did more research online and found a performance shop that makes a Viton split oil seal for the same size crankshaft as the 400. The older Pontiac 389 engines had a rope seal that tended to leak so this company manufactured this split lip seal. The tractor is split once again and a bushing is being machined to make this new seal fit into the old retainer. I am hoping this works. If you see a shiny red 400 Farmall at the 2021 show, you will know it did.



A few members stepped up to help with different tasks at the last membership meeting. Thank you to those who volunteered. A 2020 nominating committee still needs to be assembled. A nominating committee has been initiated but additional help is needed. A raffle tickets coordinator is still needed. Please consider helping where you are able. Task such as these do not get done by themselves so please think seriously about volunteering. A new door still needs to be installed in the Swenson Building when the weather cooperates. Talk to any of the board if you are willing to help.

Parade season will soon be here as well. Get those tractors tuned and shined up for another season of parades!

EXTRA: Garrett Side by Side

Gerald and Karen Kleene continue their annual winter track though the deep southern United States. Kleenes had the opportunity to visit the Paquette's Historical Farmall Museum located in Leesburg, Lake County Florida. The museum opened in 2010. It is a completely-out-of-nowhere private collection of Farmall Tractors and International Harvester machinery, displayed in two custom warehouses in the middle of Florida farm country. This museum includes fully restored models of many Farmall tractors. In addition, three large buildings house International Harvester-built equipment, including refrigerators, combines, tractors, road graders and trucks. Specifically, on display, is this Garrett Side by Side tractor manufactured in 1956 by the Garrett Manufacturing, Enumclaw, Washington. Two identical model 400 IH diesel tractors were combined into one unit. At the time of construction, it was the largest farm tractor equipped with rubber tires. The twin-driven Garrett uses each engine to power its own set of wheels. Belt horsepower of each engine is rated at 50. It was designed to be used in the forestry industry as skidder to pull logs out of the forest. Only one was built. It was sold to a farmer in Washington who used it for 30 years. Garrett Manufacturing repurchased the tractor but later sold in 2002 to Harry Lee, Elnora, Indiana, a well-known antique tractor collector, who displayed it throughout the United States. The Garrett occasionally continues to travel to shows and parades.
